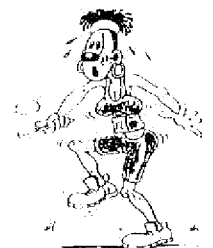
It's hard to imagine that before these houses were built on Mickley Lane, the land was occupied by Gledhills Rhubarb and Cauliflower Fields.

Dear Editor

A few weeks ago my husband and I visited Abbeydale Industrial Hamlet where my husband bought for me 'Walks around Totley' - for two reasons.

1. That occasionally we had walked and talked with 'Campy' during the 1950's when we were both members of the Pennine Mountaineering Club. Michael, my husband seems to remember the last time we saw you was in 1959 in Wales.

Secondly, because from 1936 - 1956, I lived in Totley and loved it. I thought you might like to hear about some of my memories. I lived at 81 Mickley Lane. The row of 4 cottages have now been demolished and a pair of semi's are in their place. The house was directly opposite the Spitfire.

I remember the Shepleys who built the Spitfire in memory of their son. We were all very upset when he went missing during the War. The field in which the Spitfire was built, we children called the 1st field. It was a great field for playing in. Every year a family from Attercliffe came to the 1st field for their annual trip. They would bring a picnic lunch and my Mum made them large jugs of tea. They used our toilet which was in the back yard. They came for many years - we accepted them as old friends and looked forward to their visit.

On top of Wings Hill there was an Ack-Ack battery stationed there during the War. The soldiers had no running water, so they used to bring their water truck to the back of our houses on Laverdene Ave, and fill up with water from our cellar tap. When the weather was hot, they used to spray the children - we loved it.

Some of the wives and families came to stay at our house, so they could see their husbands and dads. I don't remember where they slept - we only had two bedrooms. Perhaps they slept in the

cellar. My Dad had re-enforced the coal cellar so that we could sleep there if we were bombed. My Mum also made fresh bread and cakes for the soldiers. During the War, the river in front of our house was dammed to provide a static water tank. I hated this as it destroyed the beautiful river and it made the rats come into our house.

I went to Totley Church of England school and at 10 went to school in the chapel down Chapel Lane. We held our sports day at the Cricket Inn. My grandmother lived in the chemical yard off Queen Victoria Road, we used to watch the blacksmith putting new shoes on the waggon horses.

I could go on forever about my childhood in Totley - I loved it. Thanks for writing the book, it brought back many happy memories.

A WONDER OF THE PEAK

Let us take a scenic walk of some 6 miles to view one of the wonders of the Peak District - the landslip known as The Alport Castles.

Park the car at the popular venue of Fairholmes in the Upper Derwent Valley. If you go at the weekend, be sure to go early, for after 10 am the whole valley is pretty busy. Boots desirable for this outing on the hills; allow 4 hours to savour the walk.

Take the forest path opposite the car park exit. Yellow markers and finger post show a route through Haggside Woods direct to the imposing site of Lockerbrook Farm, now the home of the outdoor group known as the Woodcraft Folk. (The founder was Basil Rawson - a great character). Linger a while, if you ask the Warden, he will show you the plaque in the attractive garden to the memory of their founder. First class views of Derwent Edge and Ladybower Dam. Head left to the crest of the track above Hagg Farm and strike off to the right, to the first ladder stile, towards Pasture Tor and Rowlee Pasture. Markers show a well defined path. Breathtaking views of the northern edges of Kinder Scout, Win Hill and the Ashop woodlands' snake valley en route.

After approx. 1.5 miles along the peaty path you will note a broken wall line on our left, opposite this point you may wish to head to the right, towards the head waters of Ouselden Clough for 350 yards to locate a wartime crash site of a Boulton Paul Defiant fighter 'plane. The two crew members baled out over the Edale Valley (engine trouble). The aircraft has left a huge crater and the engine has since been recovered for a museum. Details of this crash story, and a Meteor jet located near the head of Haggside plantation (private ground) are in Ron Collier's

'Dark Peak Wrecks' book. Retrace your steps back to the Rowlee Pasture track and head forward to the final gem of the trek above Birchinlee Pasture - the imposing 'Alport Castles' (the largest landslip in the country - a profusive rock scape and a photographer's dream. First class views to the heights of Bleaklow, Kinder and Margery Hill and, nestling in the valley, - Alport Dale and Farm. One could linger here for many an hour.

We start the return journey back to the right and footpath across Birchinlee Pasture between Fagney and Ditch Cloughs, then a steep descent through Ditch Clough Plantation to the Westend valley. The route is well marked all the way - simply turn right along the forest track, adjacent to the Westend River and after a few hundred yards we join the road that fringes the top chain of reservoirs at the Howden Dam. Signal the minibus at the signed stop for the short drive back to the bustling activity at Fairholmes.

A welcome cuppa at the tea bar and a visit to the Information Centre makes the day complete. Mention my name at the latter - very friendly and helpful staff, they will know who you mean by stating simply "Aircraft Wrecks!".

P.S. Don't forget to check the bus times at Fairholmes, or if you prefer to walk back from the Westend valley via Howden and Derwent Dams, this will add another 3 miles to the walk.

TOTLEY YOUTH FOOTBALL CLUB

In the 1993/4 and 1994/5 season my son played competitive football for Ecclesall Rangers F.C. who play in the GT Sunday League and who are governed by the Sheffield and Hallamshire F.A. I became involved in helping with the club and was asked to manage the team during that period. After some 25 boys applied for 16 places I had the unenviable task 12 months ago of telling several boys from the Totley area that there were no vacancies for them in the team. That is one of the hardest things I have had to do, tell a boy who wants to play football at a competitive level, sorry, I can't offer you a place! "Why don't you start a new team for Totley?" asked my son who had several friends wanting to play, but unable to find a club with much sought after vacancies. A simple solution one may be excused for thinking, oh, how wrong I was!"

I contacted the GT League and filled in a form to apply for one of the 400 club places which accommodate some 6,000 boys from the Sheffield, Rotherham, Barnsley and Chesterfield areas. That was when I realised it was not going to be a simple task. We had to have a ground, insurance, official kit, nets, special size footballs, first aid equipment, registration fees, affiliation fees, an executive committee with treasure, management and bank accounts, a secretary, an AGM!!!!!----hold on, we only want a game of football on Sundays! True, but organising that many boys into

competitive leagues takes a lot of effort and money.

Enter friend of TYFC number one, Ray Clifford. Ray is the U13 Registrar for the GT Junior Sunday League and as luck would have it lives in the area. Ray guided me through the minefield of what we had to do to get our application considered along with all the others wanting to join the league, the most important is we must have a ground. OK contact Sheffield Recreation Department, sorry, no grounds available!

Enter friend of TYFC number two, John Warnock of Sheffield and Hallam University. Cutting a long story short they provided an area behind the students accommodation block, marked out

a pitch, maintained it and provided posts at competitive rates to that of the Recreation Departments. So all we need now is £400 worth of kit, &250 worth of equipment, £300 match fees, £250 gym fees in the

winter etc. etc.

Enter a group of community minded organisations. Dyson Refractories sponsored the full cost of the U13 kit thanks to Mr. Gray, the Totley Site manager and Mr. Peter Marsh, the Managing Director of the Dyson Group Plc. Totley Residents Association and in particular Margaret Coldwell who sponsored the pitch fees; Flint Electrical who provided two high quality match balls and the Midland Bank who provided 16 kit bags.

GARDENING TIPS FOR JUNE

I cannot remember a worse May for gardeners - prolonged cold, not much rain, constant frost has led to us being way behind generally. My prize leeks are not much bigger than when I put them in, in April, and the bedding plants will be way behind last year. I hope the last bit of May and this month will be better. Enough moaning - let's look forward to Summer.

FLOWERS Feed flowering plants, especially sweet peas. Containers need a weekly dose unless you have used 'Osmocoat' or similar slow release fertilizer. Keep newly-set-out plants well watered (not an easy job without hose pipes). Thin out seedlings of annuals such as clarkia, cornflower or godetia sown directly in borders and beds. Stake taller plants as necessary. Dead-head peonies after flowering and cut back oriental poppies.

Watch out for aphids and caterpillars and deal with them as soon as they are seen; spray perennials against mildew at first signs. Finish planting summer bedding and put out small perennials or biennials into nursery bed from seed sown earlier.

Take cuttings of pinks, lift divide and replant polyanthus, primroses and flag iris. Old clumps of mossy saxifrage can be divided - this is a good thing especially if they are tending to get brown in the centre. As alpine plants finish flowering cut them back - this will keep the plants neat and compact and encourage them to make good growth for next year. Sow winter flowering pansies into boxes placed in cold frame - when they are large enough to handle they can be pricked out into the garden or potted on ready for planting out later. Watch out for sucker growth on roses; cut them off as close to the root as possible.

It's always as well to have a few surplus alpine for filling bare spaces in the rock garden and many alpine cuttings can be taken now - root them in a sandy compost.

VEGETABLES Plant marrows now - they should be just right for the Show on the 7th September. They need a good rich compost mound and a bit of protection from slugs and snails. Thin out carrots and beetroot sown earlier. Plant out celery plants and keep them well watered. To keep onions growing sturdily water when soil is dry and give them a weekly feed. Plant out leeks - the best way is to make a hole with a dibber about 6" deep with one leek placed in each hole, which is then well watered - let the water carry in a

little soil, enough to cover the roots. No more filling is necessary.

Plant savoy and January King cabbages. Keep planting successional plantings of salad crops and peas. To help rhubarb build up a good crown for next year remove flower stalks and keep the plants well watered and fed - like many other plants they will appreciate a top dressing of compost. Cover curd on cauliflowers with leaves turned over to protect them from the sun.

TREES, SHRUBS AND FRUIT The small white maggots that are often found in raspberries (they don't taste very nice!) are a nuisance. They can be controlled by dusting with derris now. Suckers that sprout up from fruit trees, especially plums and damsons, need to be dug out. Mildew is often troublesome on tips of gooseberry shoots - these should be nipped out and burned. Keep tying in shoots of blackberries and loganberries.

Keep newly-planted trees and shrubs weed-free and well-watered. Pick the poisonous seeds of laburnum especially if there are children around. If azaleas, rhododendrons, camellias or hydrangeas are yellowing apply Iron Sequestrene. Spray roses with fungicide especially if you had black-spot last year. To increase your plants semi-ripe cuttings can be taken from a wide range of shrubs and trees - they make nice gifts for gardening friends, also charity stalls.

GREENHOUSE AND INDOOR PLANTS.

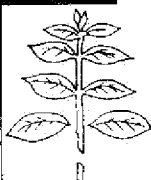
Complete the final potting of chrysanthemums. Take cuttings of regal pelargoniums. Cineraria seedlings should be pricked out into pots or seed trays. Grape-thinning needs doing regularly to keep nicely-shaped bunches and quality fruit. Begonias need careful attention to staking and support for larger flowers. Achimenes also need support - twiggy sticks inserted round the edge of the pot is a good idea.

Some tomatoes which were planted earlier should be ripening now. If some are showing signs of greenback where hard skin forms round the top of the fruit water with a solution of 1

ounce of sulphate of potash in 1 gallon of water (or the metric equivalent). Watch out for aphids, thrips, red spider mites and white fly and deal with them as soon as they are seen (it's one big battle isn't it?). Keep everything which is growing well-watered and make sure your ventilation is adequate.

LAWNS Cut and weed regularly - have your cutters set high if the weather is dry to conserve moisture at the roots. Give a feed once a month to keep it nice and green. Rake up any leaves, moss or debris to keep it nice and tidy, and cut round the edges to make it look really smart.

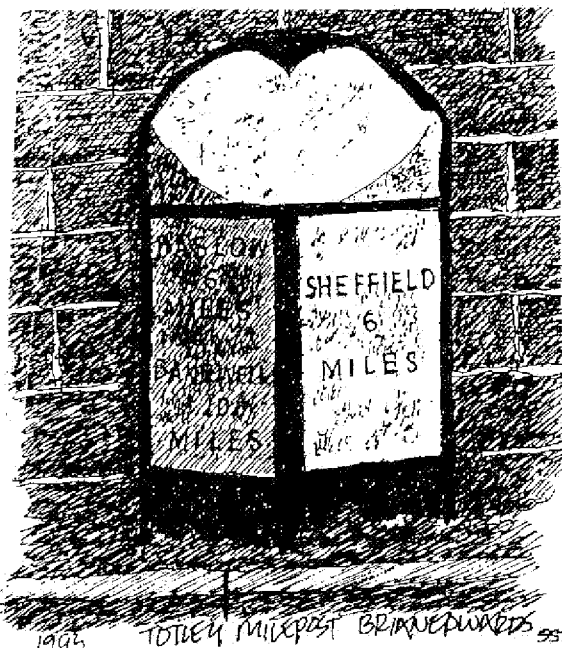
